

TECHSOFT, Inc. President Receives Outstanding Contribution Award from IEEE Computer Society

Thomas Pigoski, President and CEO of TECHSOFT, Inc., has received an Outstanding Contribution Award from the IEEE Computer Society.

The award came as a result of Pigoski's "outstanding technical and leadership contributions" as project editor of the new ISO/IEC/IEEE 14764 international standard.

The new standard establishes the process for managing and executing software maintenance activities. It is a collaborative effort involving the IEEE Computer Society, the International Organization for Standardization (ISO), and the IEC (International Electrotechnical Commission), who form the specialized system for worldwide standardization.

ISO/IEC/IEEE 14764 was sponsored by the Software & Systems Engineering Standards Committee of the IEEE Computer Society. It was approved by the IEEE Standards Board in March 2006. Pigoski's award was initially announced in July 2007.

With nearly 90,000 members, the IEEE Computer Society is the world's leading organization of computer professionals. The Society is dedicated to advancing the theory, practice, and application of computer and information processing technology.

Pigoski founded TECHSOFT in 1990 following a 20-year career in Naval cryptology, during which he planned, established, and directed the operation of software activities for large-scale U.S. Department of Defense systems.
